



## **A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR**



My grandmother is 98 years old. She is sharp as a tack and can name every student she went to first grade with. I've spent a lot of time wondering what she has seen in her lifetime. Nearly a century has moved across her eyes. Her mind has trapped memories from a life well-lived. But the memories that are cherished don't have anything to do with the history of that century. It is made up of relationships, friendships, and loved ones.

Much like Miss Daisy Werthan of our story, my grandmother has memories of historic moments, but they usually tie to who she was with and how her community felt. *Driving Miss Daisy* takes place from 1948 (when Daisy is already 72) and ends in 1973. The Civil Rights Movement is the centerpiece historic moment of this story. But that's not the conduit through which our story is told. It's told through moments, memories, and snapshots of an unlikely friendship that develops alongside a historic period in our shared history.

Boolie faces the same challenges that many of us face with aging parents. How do we keep them safe? How do we ensure they feel loved? How do we honor their independence? Hoke becomes a large part of that answer for Boolie. And, whether she likes it or not, Hoke becomes a companion for Daisy. But their experiences through this snapshot of history are completely different. Their past is not shared, even though it is intertwined. How does friendship develop amid difference, in a world that lacks compassion for difference? This is the central question at the heart of *Driving Miss Daisy*.

What a challenge to direct a show that is loved in the hearts of many through a different artistic medium. *Driving Miss Daisy* started as a play and became an Oscarwinning film. This challenge — collaborating to breathe new life into the play — has been one that has stretched our heart strings in every direction. It has been a labor of love to look at our own current lives through the lens of the past.

I don't know Mr. Uhry, but his goal to "write what you know" is evident in the care for his Jewish-American heritage through his three Atlanta stories of *Driving Miss Daisy, Last Night of Ballyhoo*, and *Parade*. In these plays, "Each of the characters... learns to look beneath the surface and find the humanity beneath the skin." As Uhry says, "If spending time with Miss Daisy and Hoke and Boolie pushes anybody in that direction, I'll be a happy man." Whether you want change or you want to change, it always starts with the desire to know our own hearts better through the relationship with others. No matter your moment in history.






